


## A quick overview of the NHS

## **Introducing BHT**

Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust (BHT) provides both acute hospital and community services for people living in Buckinghamshire and the surrounding area.



### **Routes into the NHS**

- Apply for entry level roles straight from education.
- Apply for registered healthcare professional roles after university.
- Apprenticeships.
- T-levels (technical qualifications for 16 19 year olds which include an industry placement).
- Work experience placements and volunteering are useful ways of demonstrating knowledge, experience, commitment and values.





## What is an apprenticeship?

- Combines practical training in a job with study: earn as you learn.
- Apprentices are employed and receive a salary.
- Full-time apprentices spend a minimum of 6 hours on 'off the job' training.
- If not already achieved, apprentices undertake maths and English qualifications.





## What is an apprenticeship?

- A qualification taken during an apprenticeship is equal to the same qualification taken elsewhere.
- Depending on the apprenticeship, upon successful completion, apprentices may be eligible to apply for professional registration.
- No fixed entry date, unlike traditional routes.
- Consider level 3 or level 5 apprenticeship and then top up to degree level.

## **Apprenticeships at BHT**

- At our Trust, apprenticeships are mainly used to progress existing staff.
- The usual route is to gain an entry level position such as a healthcare support worker (for a clinical role) or an administrative post (for a non-clinical role) – so you can see opportunities and then apply internally.
- Get practical on-the-job experience which helps you examine different roles.
- Hopefully external application will become available as opportunities widen and more funding is made available.






## What kinds of apprenticeships do we offer at BHT?

- We offer a range of clinical and non-clinical roles (such as Business Administration), although nursing is our main apprenticeship pathway, with colleagues undertaking:
  - Level 3 Senior Healthcare Support Worker Apprenticeship
  - Level 5 Nursing Associate Apprenticeship
  - Level 6 Registered Nurse Degree Apprenticeship





### **Nursing apprenticeship pathways at BHT**



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### Senior Healthcare Support Worker Apprenticeship (level 3)



Senior Healthcare Support Workers support registered practitioners to deliver high quality, compassionate health and social care to people. They carry out a range of clinical and non-clinical healthcare or therapeutic tasks, under the direct or indirect supervision of the registered healthcare practitioner. They work in a range of services eg hospital, primary, community, health or day case units and many other settings.





# How do I become a Senior Healthcare Support Worker Apprentice at BHT?

To become an apprentice, you must be first employed by us.

#### **Entry requirements:**

- Completed Maths and English at Level 2 (equivalent to GCSE Grade C/4 or Functional Skills Level 2)
- Care certificate (a set of standards for health and care professionals)
  - the Trust will enable you to achieve this while working for us

#### **Nursing Associate Apprenticeship (level 5)**



Nursing associate is a new role within the nursing team. Nursing associates work with healthcare support workers and registered nurses to deliver care for patients and the public. It is also a stepping stone to becoming a registered nurse.





#### How do I become a Nursing Associate Apprentice at BHT?

To become an apprentice, you must be first employed by us.

#### **Entry requirements:**

- Level 3 (NVQ/A-Level)
- Completed Maths and English at Level 2 (equivalent to GCSE Grade C/4 or Functional Skills Level 2)
- Care certificate (a set of standards for health and care professionals)
   the Trust will enable you to achieve this while working for us

#### Registered Nurse Degree Apprenticeship (RNDA) (level 6)



The Registered Nurse Degree Apprenticeship develop healthcare staff towards registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Council, as either adult or child registered nurses.





# How do I become a Registered Nurse Degree Apprentice at BHT?

To become an apprentice, you must be first employed by us.

#### **Entry requirements:**


- Level 5 Foundation Degree in Nursing Associate (NA) or Assistant Practitioner (AP) programme or has completed the first year of BSc Nursing degree within the last five years.
- Completed 6 12 months consolidation period upon completion of NA or AP programme.
- Completed Maths and English at Level 2 (equivalent to GCSE Grade C/4 or Functional Skills Level 2).
- Evidence of at least 675 practice hours completed.
- If you are moving on from a level 5 apprenticeship, you must have completed your final stage End Point Assessment.

### How to apply for apprenticeships in the wider NHS


- Vacancies for apprenticeships also appear on Government's 'find an apprenticeship' live jobs website. Register for an account to set up email and text alerts about new opportunities: www.findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk/
- See apprenticeship opportunities across the whole NHS at <u>jobs.nhs.uk</u>: select 'apprenticeships' from browse job types.
- Unlike university applications, there is no fixed deadline to apply for apprenticeships: always keep an eye out.
- All applications are online: CVs are not accepted.

- This is called the <u>NHS Constitution</u>, which is made up of six values: read more at <u>about the NHS values</u>.






